This will require a multi-pronged approach to adequately address it from prevention, diagnosis, management, treatment and research perspectives.

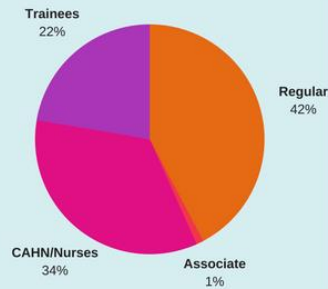

WHO ARE OUR CASL MEMBERS?

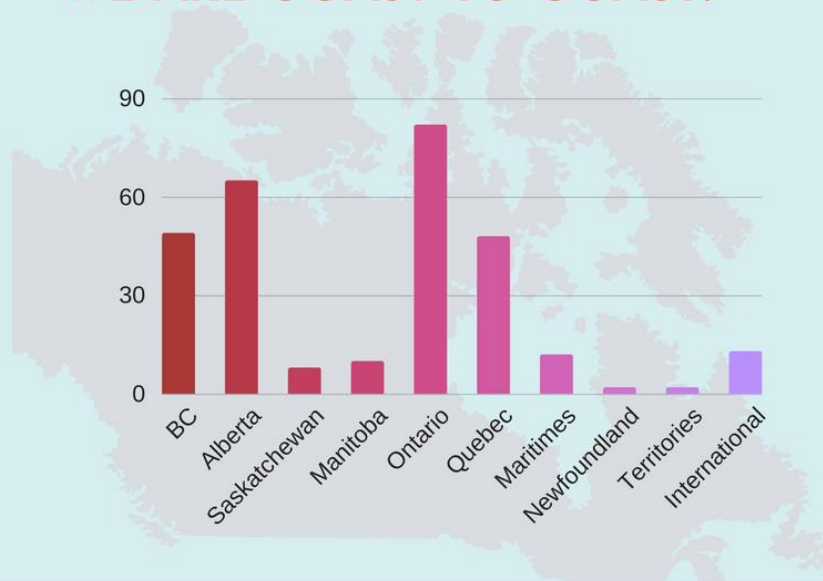


Our membership is the largest it has ever been! But who makes up our hepatology community? Here is a snapshot!

Choosing Wisely Canada Update

Choosing Wisely Canada is a campaign to help clinicians and patients engage in conversations about unnecessary tests and treatments and make smart and effective choices to ensure high-quality care.

CASL has approved our top five recommendations which will be released in more detail on the Choosing Wisely website in June.

The Top 5 Recommendations include:

1. Don't order serum ammonia to diagnose or manage hepatic encephalopathy (HE)
2. Don't routinely transfuse fresh frozen plasma, vitamin K, prothrombin complex concentrate, or platelets to reverse abnormal tests of coagulation in patients with cirrhosis prior to abdominal paracentesis, endoscopic variceal band ligation, or any other minor invasive procedures.
3. Don't order HFE genotyping based on serum ferritin values alone to diagnose hereditary hemochromatosis.
4. Don't perform computed tomography (CT) or magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) routinely to monitor benign focal liver lesions (ex. focal nodal hyperplasia, hemangioma).
5. Don't repeat hepatitis C viral load testing in an individual who has established chronic infection, outside of antiviral treatment

CME Slides Update

In collaboration with Dr. Christopher Rose, Dr. Hemant Shah, Dr. Puneeta Tandon and Dr. Phil Wong, a continuing medical education (CME) slide deck on hepatic encephalopathy will be available through both the Canadian Association for the Study of the Liver and the Canadian Liver Foundation website. These slides illustrate the heavy burden of hepatic encephalopathy on the patient and their caregivers as well as on health care systems. Pathogenesis, diagnosis and treatment strategies are also detailed.
